NOTICE

With reference to the earlier notice (Dated 28/09/2020, Memo no. COE/2220/2020/21) all examinees concerned are being informed that **Online BDP Term End Theory (Exit) Examinations December 2019 & June 2020** are scheduled to be held from **06.10.2020 at 11 am to 13.10.2020 at 11 am**.

1) A dedicated portal (**<https://nsou.bdp2020.smartestexam.com>**) for the said examinations will be opened on **06.10.2020 at 11 am** and will be closed on **13.10.2020 at 11 am** (24 hours for seven days).

2) The examinees concerned have to complete their all papers (as mentioned in the Admit card) within seven days (from 06.10.2020 at 11 am to 13.10.2020 at 11 am) from the commencement (06.10.2020 at am) of the said examinations.

It may please be noted that sample questions for the said examinations have already been uploaded at the official website of NSOU.

3) These examinations are being arranged only for "Exit" students. **Exit Students** means who have taken admission during the period from July 2014 to July 2017 (since a student may get maximum six years to complete BDP course).

4) The students who have completed all pre examination formalities (such as submission of assignment answer booklets, submission of filled in examination form for all remaining paper/s for the said examinations etc.) for **Online BDP Term End Theory (Exit) Examinations December 2019 & June 2020** are eligible for

these **Exit examinations**.

5) Examinees may appear in the said examinations through a Smartphone or Tab (Tablet PC) or Laptop or Desktop Computer with an active data connectivity. It may please be noted that the examinees concerned can't login through more than one device at the same time.

6) MCQ method are being followed in the said online examinations.

7) The examinees have to answer the questions only putting a tick (✓) in the proper place.

8) Examinees are not allowed to go back or edit any answer which is already submitted by them.

9) These said Online Examinations don't have the provision for Negative marking.

10) Instead of 100 marks, the examinees have to answer 20 question (each of 1 mark) which is equivalent to 100 marks. Where the full marks is 50, the examinees have to answer 10 question (each of 1mark) which is equivalent to 50 marks.

11) The examinees will get three hours for 100 marks and two hours for 50 marks to complete a particular paper. After that, time will be out for that paper.


12) The examinees will get 9 (nine) 'pause' for 100 marks and 4 (four) 'pause' for 50 marks for a particular paper. It may please be noted that after any kind of interruption (pause), the examinees can re-join, but instead of the earlier question they will get a new question of the same paper. But after taking the scope of all pauses, time will be out. So the examination of the paper concerned will automatically be locked and submit the responses after the pause limit is over.

13) The examinees have to save and submit the answer before going for the next question. After answer all questions they have to do final submission.


14) The examinees may appear in any time, in any paper according to their choice, but they will get the scope to appear in another paper only after submission of the earlier paper.

15) After final submission of a particular paper examinees may save and download the paper to get a print copy of answer script for their own.
