এই মহাবিদ্যালয়ের বর্তমান ও আগামী অধ্যাপক-অধ্যাপিকা, ছাত্র-ছাত্রী শিক্ষাকর্মীদের সকলকে প্রীতি ও শুভেচ্ছা। এই মহাবিদ্যালয়ের পরিকাঠামোর বিন্যাস, বর্ধন এবং কলেজের সঙ্গে যুক্ত সকলের কৃত্যলিপি ও অনুশাসন বিধি লিপিবদ্ধ এই Prospectus এ। পরিচালন সমিতির সভাপতি হিসাবে আমার কিছু বক্তব্য সকলের সমীপে উপস্থাপিত করতে চাই।

আমার আবাল্য শ্রুতিতে অবস্থান ছিল দীনবন্ধু কলেজ ও বিদ্যালয়ের নাম। এ কলেজে প্রথিতযশা অধ্যাপক নীলকণ্ঠ শ্রী দীপেন্দ্র সান্যালের গুণগ্রাহী ছিলাম আমরা। শিক্ষারূপে উৎসর্গীকৃত মহাপ্রাণ ডাঃ দীনবন্ধু মুখোপাধ্যায় এ অঞ্চলে বিদ্যালয়ের প্রতিষ্ঠা করেন। প্রায় ১৫০ বছর আগে হাওড়া তথা পশ্চিমবঙ্গের শিক্ষাভিযানের অগ্রপথিক অধ্যক্ষ বিজয়কৃষ্ণ ভট্টাচার্যের সক্রিয়তায় এই বিদ্যালয় সংলগ্ন জমিতে মহাবিদ্যালয়ের প্রতিষ্ঠা হয় প্রায় ৭০/৭২ বছর আগে।

এ অঞ্চল তখন ছিল প্রায় আলো-আঁধারিতে আবৃত। জীবিকার পাষণ্ডসুপে জীবনের রক্তকরবী দেখা দিল শিক্ষার প্রদীপ হিসাবে। অনেক চরাই উতরাই পেরিয়ে এই মহাবিদ্যালয় এখন সমৃদ্ধির শিখরে। শিক্ষার equity, excellence, expansion-এ ত্রিবেনী সংগম এই মহাবিদ্যালয়ের আমাদের উপহার দিয়েছে। গণ শিক্ষার দুয়ার খুলেছে, SC/ST ছাত্ররা, জাতিধর্ম নির্বিশেষে সবাই এখানে ভরতির অবাধ সুযোগ পাচ্ছে। সর্বতোমুখী শিক্ষার বাতায়ন অর্গলমুক্ত মুক্ত শিক্ষার প্রচলন হয়েছে - প্রাতঃ, মধ্যাহ্ন ও সন্ধ্যায় বিভিন্ন ছাত্র-ছাত্রী বিভিন্ন বিভাগ এখানে পঠনের সুযোগ পাচ্ছে। সাংস্কৃতিক বাতাবরণ এখানে সম্ব্রীতির সূচনা করেছে। Prospectus-এ বিভিন্ন পরিকাঠামোগত উন্নতি বিশেষ করে নতুন Full Time ও Part Time অধ্যাপক নিয়োগ কথা, উপর্যুপরি NAAC এর কৃতিপত্রে এ মহাবিদ্যালয়ের অবস্থানের কথা উল্লিখিত আছে।

ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Shibpur Dinobundhoo Institution (College) is one of the pioneer colleges embracing a vast hinterland of urban and semi-urban areas of Howrah district. Established in 1948, the college has consolidated its position as one of the leading institutions of the district, imparting undergraduate learning in diverse areas of Humanities, Social Science, Bio and Pure Sciences and Commerce. The college is affiliated to the University of Calcutta and accredited by NAAC (National Assessment And Accreditation Council) up to 2nd cycle with the "grade B". From the academic session 2009-2010, the college is proud to have introduced Post Graduate Course in Commerce (M.Com) offered by the University of Calcutta. From 2016-17, P.G. Course (Distance) in Chemistry under Vidyasagar University has been introduced.

Location : The College is situated in the Southern Part of Howrah Municipal Corporation Area on the west bank of the river Hoogly, very close to Vidyasagar Setu and on a major arterial road in the city, viz., the Grand Trunk Road. It is therefore, well connected to all other parts of Howrah city, the district and the Kolkata metropolis. On one side of the G.T. Road, we have an industrial belt, hence, having a large concentration of working class population, on the other side, we have a middle class settlement. A large railway colony exists close to the college campus because of the S.E. Railway Freight and Passenger Terminal at Shalimar. The overall demographic characteristics and cultural diversity of the locality are reflected in the composition of the student community of our college. We proudly maintain this tradition.

HISTORY AND OBJECTIVITIES

After 1947, as post colonial and Independent India witnessed the emergence of a reorganisation of higher education in the country, radically different from the colonial perspective and perception, our national leaders adopted a wider perspective on the character of higher education in free India ; "to provide a coherent picture of Universe and integrated way of life." The need of more higher education in the district of Howrah was felt by Prof. Bijoy Krishna Bhattacharya a well known freedom fighter, Satyagrahi, Prof. Bhattacharya's dream became a reality when on August 16, 1948, the college with

the help of Late Kiron Chandra Sinha, Late Bholanath Mukherjee, Late Krishnadhan Chatterjee, Late Dr. Beni Charan Dutta and Late Ganesh Chandra Mukherjee, this College was established. The College was named after Late Dr. Dinobundhoo Mukherjee, a renowned physician and an educationist of Howrah District. On the 1st of December 1947, Prof, Bijoy Krishna Bhattacharya, President of the Managing Committee of Shibpur Dinobundhoo Institution, Proposed in a Managing Committee meeting that intermediate Classes may be started in the school building.

Given the above back ground, and consistent with the general trend in West Bengal, enrolment in the college gradually increased during the 1950s. Science subjects were introduced in 1958. During the decade between 1948 and 1958, 1209 students graduated from this college. A tremendous growth in demands for higher education among the local population was observed during 1960 and 1970s on account of which the college. In 1976 degree courses in B.A Pass in the Day Section was made co-educational and the Morning Section of the college was opened exclusively for the girls in the Higher Secondary Classes. In 1977, B. Com Pass course was introduced.

Since then the college has moved forward; it has a chequered history of growth and expansion. In 1960, the college was permitted to open Honours course in English, Bengali, History, and Commerce. Subsequently, the college opened Honours courses in Pure Science subjects.

Consistent with the tradition of the college, its goal is a faster opportunities for higher education in select branches of study for benefit of the local community and to create a modern ambience for a learner-centric educational environment. The college is planning to introduce Honours in Urdu, Hindi, and zoology in near future.

The college had been accredited by NAAC in the month of March, 2007 with Grade B.

NAAC RE-ACCREDITATION

The College has been re-accredited by NAAC in the year 2015 with Grade B (2.50 CGPA).

The 3 year B.A. / B.Sc. (Honours and General) Course of Studies under CBSE shall consist of six (6) Semesters (Semester-I, Semester-II, Semester-III, Semester-IV, Semester-V and Semester-VI). End Semester Examination are to be held ordinarily at the end of the concerned Semester, i.e., semester-I, Semester-III, Semester-V in December-January and Semester-II, Semester-IV, Semester-VI in June-July. End Semester Examinations will be held for 80% of the total marks in each paper and Internal Assessment shall be for 20% of the total marks of each paper/subject/module. 50% of the total marks assigned to Internal Assessment (i.e., 10 marks for a full paper of 100 or 5 marks for a Module of 50, as the case may be) will be assessed on the basis of Internal Examination and remaining 50% will be assessed based on the class attendance (6 marks for attending 60% or above but less than 75% of the number of lectures delivered; 8 marks for attending 75% or above but less than 90% of the number of lectures delivered; and 10 marks for attending 90% or above of lectures delivered and such attendance will be calculated from the date of commencement of classes or date of admission whichever is later).

CGPA shall be calculated and shown up to three decimal places. SGPA is the SGPA of the j^{th} Semester ($j = 1$ to 6) and C_j is the total credit of j^{th} Semester used for Grade Point Calculation.

Orientation Programme for the students will be conducted before the commencement of the Semester I classes. library Orientation Programme for the students will also be conducted before the issue of the library cards.

Parent Teacher Meeting :

Parent-teacher meeting will be held in after the Mid-Term Examination.

Games and Sports :

In the college, there are facilities available for games like football, Cricket, Kho-Kho etc. Exceptionally talented players participate at the University level.

Excursions and Study Tour :

The college takes ample interest incorporating the study tour or excursions within the curriculum of different subjects (like History, Political Science etc.) with an aim to increase the interests of the students. Such academic excursions are mandatory for the subjects like Geography and Physical Education.

Generator :

The college has a powerful generator for providing power back-up during the time of power failure.

Academic Session :

The **Semester-I, Semester-III, Semester-V** commences from 1st July and ends on the 30th December (6 months), **Semester-II, Semester-IV, Semester-VI** commences from 1st January and ends on the 30th June (6 months).

GENERAL RULES

Attendance

1. Students are required to maintain regular attendance as per University of Calcutta regulations.
2. A student will be allowed to appear in CU Semester I/II/III/IV/V/VI on the basis of regular attendance.
 - i) Attendance 75% and above (Collegiate)
 - ii) Attendance 60% to below 75% (Non-collegiate) after paying Condonation Fee Rs. 100/- to CU.
3. A student will NOT be allowed to appear in CU Semester I/II/III/IV/V/VI if the Attendance is below 60%.
4. Students must appear in the Internal Examinations and Tutorial / Practical Examinations.
5. Science students must attend both the theoretical and practical classes regularly. Students who do not regularly attend theoretical classes may not be permitted to attend practical classes.

Admission in the semester II, III, IV & V for B.A/B.Sc. / B. Com (General & Honours) Courses

6. Every outgoing students of Semester-I, Semester-II, Semester-III Semester-IV and Semester-V must get themselves admitted in Semester-II, Semester-III, Semester-IV, Semester-V and Semester-VI respectively before the commencement of the next Semester.

Refund of Caution Deposit

7. Refund of deposit will be made at the completion of courses after the deduction of a general breakage charge as per existing college rules. The rule will also apply to students taking transfer in the middle of a session.
8. No refund will be made to students if it is not claimed within three years from the date of publication of University results.
9. Students must produce Receipt in original, Library Clearance and must return library Card at the time of refund.

Transfer and Withdrawal

10. Application for transfer and withdrawal from the College must be made in writing the Principal at least 10 days before the end of a month. Transfer or withdrawal will be granted to a student only on payment of all college dues and on obtaining clearance from the Library, Laboratory, NCC and other relevant departments. Necessary Transfer Fee will also have to be paid.

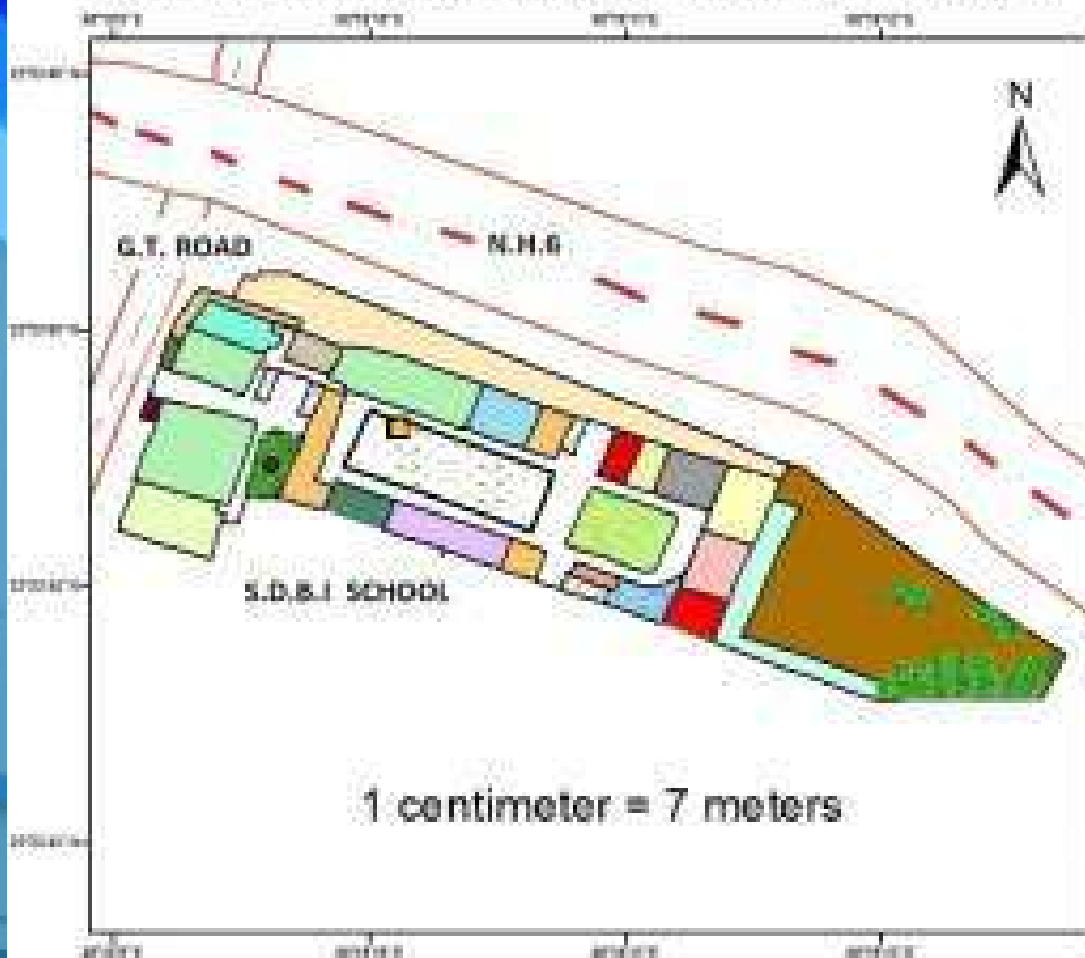
